Overview

The mission of the Texas Emergency Services Retirement System (TESRS) is to be a recognized leader and preferred retirement system provider for the emergency services community by delivering unequalled products and fiduciary services through a highly qualified staff of professionals committed to integrity and excellence. The agency provides effective and sound benefits to volunteer fire and emergency medical service personnel under Title 8 of the Government Code, Subtitle H.

Organization and Responsibilities

The Executive Director is selected by the TESRS Board and heads the agency. Day-to-day operations are accomplished by the agency's nine employees under the direction of the Executive Director.

The agency is located in the Thomas J. Rusk Building, a state-owned property, along with other state agencies. While the agency does not have direct control over energy and water usage, the few staff who work in the office staff practice efficient usage of energy and water. The state facilities management staff have installed energy-saving auto-off lighting and have taken other energy and water conservation measures.

At the present time, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, staff present in the office varies based on need and preference of workplace. One staff is assigned each week as office manager with responsibilities regarding the processing and routing of incoming US Mail. Other staff, depending on need and personal preference, may also work at the office. Our work environment is entirely cloud-based, therefore, staff telework who are not assigned as office manager and who do not have need to work in the office.

Annual reports regarding energy and water conservation are provided to the State Energy Conservation Office.
